

Chart 1. Matched Taxable Gross Receipts Per Quarter




Over the last eight quarters matched taxable gross receipts (MTGR) have averaged \$946M, which is \$22M less than the amount reported during Q1 FY24 (\$968M). From Q4 FY23 to Q1 FY24 MTGR decreased by nearly 0.4% or just over \$4M. Despite this decline MTGR in San Juan County has an upward trend. Shown in Chart 2, the retail trade and construction industries accounted for 41% of San Juan County's total MTGR.

Matched Taxable Gross Receipts (MTGR) are the best tax data available to show underlying economic activity. The data collection process matches a tax payment with reported receipts for each taxpayer by industry.

In the first quarter of FY24, 28 of 33 counties saw year-over-year economic growth, with 9.1% growth statewide in matched taxable gross receipts (MTGR). State gross receipts increased from the fourth quarter of FY23, bringing it to the highest ever quarterly total in MTGR for the state.

Table 1 shows that, when comparing year-over-year (YOY) MTGR growth, the largest contribution came from the construction industry, which posted a YOY increase of \$17M. The largest decline came from the mining, quarrying, and oil and gas extraction industry, which posted a YOY decrease of \$44M. The agriculture, forestry, fishing, and hunting industry, in Table 1, shows negative MTGR in Q1 FY23. This could be due to amended tax filings with TRD. The amount of quarterly gross receipts taxes (GRT) collected during Q1 FY24 (\$15M) was 18.3% more than the amount collected during Q4 FY23 (\$12.7M), as seen in Chart 4.

Chart 3. Annual Total GRT Revenue Collections




Chart 4. Quarterly GRT Revenue Collections





Chart 5. Total Employment & Weekly Wage



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
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Chart 6. Establishment Year-Over-Year % Change

Chart 7. Calendar Year % Change In Real GDP Year-Over-Year


